Scripture Reflection

In today's Gospel, when the 72 disciples returned from the mission on which Jesus sent them, they were jubilant because evil spirits were subject to them. Jesus warned that they should not rejoice because spirits were subject to them but, instead, because their names were written in heaven. In other words, don't get caught up in the dramatic aspects of ministry; rejoice in the aspects that are not as obvious. This applies to us as well. Many times, we might think that the people who are more visible in ministry are more "important" in the building up of the Body of Christ...especially if their ministries are more dramatic. Yet, visibility is often its own reward, and our ability to be part of a visible ministry is not a comment on our importance or holiness. That which is unseen or that which is seen by very few is often far more important in the long run: examples include praying for the people on our prayer list, comforting one grieving person, teaching one child, visiting one ill or homebound person. These kinds of activities don't attract much attention, but they are as important to the life of the Body of Christ as the air we breathe is important to the life of our bodies. We don't "see" the air, but the fact that we breathe easily tells us air is present. We don't always "see" certain ministries, but the vitality of a faith community tells us they are present and that the names of those who minister faithfully are written in heaven.
